BLAINE MARINE PARK

Blaine Marine Park, a charming waterfront park, sits between Drayton Harbor and Semiahmoo Bay on the Salish Sea. Level and easy to navigate, the park is perfect for walking, biking, running, kite-flying, kayaking, fishing, crabbing, playing in a maritime-themed playground, and bird and wildlife viewing. The park consists of several covered and uncovered waterside shelters, walking/biking trails, a marine-themed playground, public fishing pier, a commercial wharf district, and 629 state-of-the-art boat slips for commercial and pleasure boats with a public boat launch.

The harbor side of the park has a covered promenade with benches and tables with views over the public marina.

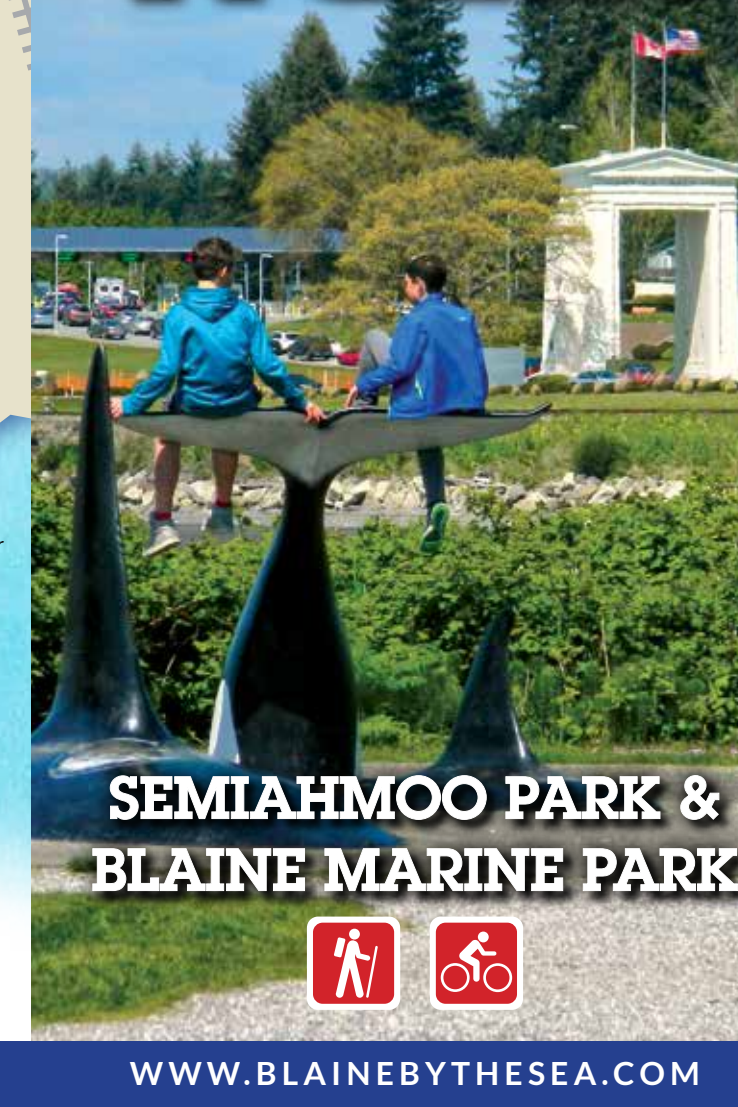

EXPLORE. EXPERIENCE. SEMAIHMUO PARK & PENINSULA

There are endless activities to do in Semiahmoo Park. The park sits on a 1.25-mile peninsula extending between Drayton Harbor and Semiahmoo Bay, known as Semiahmoo Spit. The park is a great destination for year-round family fun, offering great outdoor activities. The park is perfect for walking, Biking, Kite-flying, picnicking, kayaking, stand-up paddleboarding, clamming, and beachcombing. You'll find incredible views of Drayton Harbor, Mount Baker, Canada's Golden Ears, Semiahmoo Bay, and White Rock, BC. Semiahmoo Spit is home to Semiahmoo Resort-Golf-Spa, a casual Northwest seaside resort surrounded by the Salish Sea.

There's something for everyone here. Hikers looking for a stroll, families beach-combing, kid's tidal pool exploring, the park features:

- 300 acres of tide flats to explore
- Covered and uncovered picnic areas
- Information kiosks
- Walking, biking & roller blading trails
- Restaurant & café
- Waterfront beaches for swimming, tidal pool exploring, kayaking, and SUP
- Pet-friendly - for our leashed four-legged friends

Semiahmoo Park Trails

Semiahmoo Parkway Trail in the wooded uplands combines the Pacific Northwest landscape's lushness with Semiahmoo Resort-Golf-Spa's charm on the Salish Sea. The trail goes from Semiahmoo Resort out Semiahmoo Parkway to the wooden uplands, past Semiahmoo Golf Course and several gated communities to Horizon Drive. The path is approximately 3.6 miles long, with a round-trip of 7.2 miles.

Semiahmoo Park Trail is approximately 0.46 miles long. It runs along the beach-side of Drayton Harbor from the park entrance past Semiahmoo Marina to the Semiahmoo Wharf Pier at the end of Semiahmoo Spit. Here you will find a gently-sloping sandy beach known as "the secret beach," perfect for summertime fun in the sun. Located here is the docking pier for the Plover Passenger Ferry that runs seasonally, Memorial Day through Labor Day. The trail has picnic tables, benches, and a covered picnic area with an information kiosk.

Semiahmoo Bay Beach-side Trail runs along the beach-side of Semiahmoo Bay, covering approximately 0.40 miles. There are three public beach access paths along Semiahmoo Parkway that allows access to Semiahmoo Bay.

Alaska Packers Association

The Alaska Packers' Association was a San Francisco-based manufacturer of canned Alaska salmon. The Semiahmoo cannery operated from 1880 until 1973, when it was closed and turned into the Semiahmoo Resort.

The Alaska Packers' Association is best known for running the "Star Fleet," the last fleet of tall ships under sail on the West Coast, as late as 1927. The museum occupies one of the original cannery buildings. The museum exhibits tell the story of days gone by and include a complete history of the Salmon cannery on Semiahmoo Spit in the early 1900s. Drayton Harbor Maritime manages the museum, which is open year-round on weekends thanks to a volunteer staff. Cost-free, but donations accepted.

Ride the Historic Plover Ferry (seasonal)

Step aboard the Historic Plover Passenger Ferry and experience a piece of Blaine's living history. Built in 1944, the Plover once carried cannery workers across the water. Today, it invites you to glide across Drayton Harbor and Semiahmoo Bay, where you can watch for migrant birds, waterfowl, and playful harbor seals. Running from Memorial Day through Labor Day, the Plover carries up to 20 passengers and is proudly listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Make this charming ferry ride part of your coastal adventure.

On the Water Recreation

Semiahmoo Bay and Drayton Harbor have become a destination for kayakers and paddleboarders. Getting out on the water allows the opportunity for adventure with nature viewing wildlife with sightings of otters, harbor seals, migratory birds, and taking in one of Semiahmoo Bay's extraordinary sunsets! Semiahmoo's Beach Activities Center provides kayak, paddleboard, and bike rentals May through September.

Bird Watching Pause along Semiahmoo Spit and let the sights and sounds of birdlife surround you. Watch flocks of waterfowl sweep across Drayton Harbor and Semiahmoo Bay, where over 250 species make their home. Spot Bald Eagles soaring overhead, catch glimpses of Peregrine Falcons, and marvel at the colorful gatherings of loons, grebes, ducks, and herons. Semiahmoo Spit and Blaine Marine Park are recognized as Important Birding Areas and anchor the North Cascades Loop of the Great Washington State Birding Trail. Each March, the Wings Over Water Northwest Birding Festival celebrates this vibrant sanctuary. Take a leisurely stroll along Blaine's pristine shoreline and discover the magic of birdwatching at your own pace.

Marine Life Viewing Pause by the Semiahmoo Marina breakwater and watch harbor seals surface with curious eyes. These playful residents are often spotted between Semiahmoo Wharf Pier and Jorgensen Public Pier, offering unforgettable moments for wildlife lovers. Remember to keep a respectful distance—binoculars let you enjoy close-up views while giving the seals plenty of space.



Grab a bite to eat:

Semiahmoo Marina Café offers espresso, soups, sandwiches, daily specials, and a kid's menu. Showcases a gallery featuring works created by local artists.

Packers Kitchen +Bar inside Semiahmoo Resort. Seaside dining overlooking Semiahmoo Bay and White Rock, BC.

Seaview Café a full-service restaurant inside Semiahmoo Resort, offering breakfast, coffee, or to end the day with a cold, craft beer by the fireplace. Open Daily, 7AM – 9PM. Complimentary stunning seaside vistas.
